### COVID GUIDELINES

Covid-19 has not disappeared and there are an increasing number of cases. Many restrictions have been lifted, but if we are to contain outbreaks, we ask you to continue to be mindful and observe the following England Netball guidelines.

- If a person tests positive, they must not attend any netball activity and they must self-isolate at home for 10 days in line with Government guidance.
- Government guidance states that if you have been fully vaccinated or are U18 you will be exempt from being required to self-isolate if you are a contact of a positive case. You will instead be advised to take a PCR test as soon as possible.
- Anyone who is identified as a close contact of someone who tests positive should do a COVID-19 test on the day of any netball activity and can only attend if this test is negative.
- Those who are not fully vaccinated should continue to self-isolate and not attend any netball activity if they are a close contact of someone testing positive.

Clubs should notify NLNL if there are any positive Covid tests within a club. This enables us to advise the appropriate club Covid Officers that there may have been a close contact situation during a NLNL fixture. Notifications should be sent to [covid@nl.nl.co.uk](mailto:covid@nl.nl.co.uk).

The NHS Test and Trace QR code is displayed at the venue and we encourage all attending to use this.

Before attending all participants should carry out self-assessment re COVID-19 symptoms.

Netballs should be sanitised before and after play, players should sanitise their hands before and after play.

Water bottles and whistles must not be shared.

Where possible the sharing of bibs should be minimised.

Masks should be worn when accessing toilet facilities in the pavilion.

Shower facilities will not be available. Changing facilities will be open but players and officials are encouraged to arrive ready for matches and only use the facilities if absolutely essential.

Spectators are not permitted on courts 4, 5 or 6. Spectators will be permitted on all other courts but should observe social distancing and avoid congregation in groups, particularly adjacent to court access gates.
